January 8<sup>th</sup> back surgery gave immediate relief. He has been recovering well back in South Africa since February, and on mission!



He even began recycling grey water for use in the gardens and flushing toilets. Like most people, we purchase bottled drinking water. Our prayers continue for ending the draught, with an abundant rainy season in the Western Cape.


